Holistic Well-being On-Campus Health Initiatives

Highlights:

- > 2274 OP patients treated
- 30 patients treated at the therapy center
- 34 RSTC children were treated on numerous occasions for various problems ranging from diarrhea, fever, skin diseases and so on
- 240+ patients were referred for surgeries and secondary care
- Established a new Integrated Treatment facility and an In-Patient facility
- Out-Reach Siddha OP
- Camps Eye care camp, Physiotherapy camp, Blood donation camp
- 84 students are now pursuing their bachelor's / Diploma in various colleges
- 10 students have been hired successfully by Esteemed organisations



Therapies and Treatments

The beginning of 2022 marked a remarkable year in our health initiative journey. During the pandemic, our door-to-door services by the health team paved the way for creating an integrated health service center for the people of rural communities. Our well-being center now offers therapies ranging from:

- Homeopathy
- Siddha treatments
- Mud bath
- NaturopathyMassages
 - assages Physiotherapy
- Acupuncture therapy

Also, there is an in-patient facility available now to treat acute pains & infections, disc injuries, chronic conditions like diabetes, OAs, allergic conditions, paralysis and others. As part of the treatment plan, our Health Animators prepare colorful drinks and healing foods such as herbal teas, juices, soups and salads.

In our Well Being (aka Curative) center we have been able to successfully treat the following health conditions:

- Recurrent skin infections bacterial, fungal and viral
- Acute diarrheal diseases and fevers
- Acute management of disc bulge and prolapse
- Gynecological disorders

- Eye infections conjunctivitis, stye
 - Wounds and ulcers (including diabetic ulcers)
 - Sequelae of cerebrovascular injuries
 - Renal stones and renal failure

and much more through our integrated traditional medical practices.

Eye Camp

- 55 patients from 10 villages attended and they were able to procure eyeglasses at a nominal price
- Mukesh a 12-year-old boy with Macular Dystrophy condition received 4X magnifying glasses
- Diabetic patients got retinal screening done

A free eye camp was organized with the help of Ophthalmologist Dr. Mothi Krupa Shankar who is a good friend and well-wisher of Payir. He brought some high-tech equipment such as the fundus camera and trained the local staff on refraction, fundus photography and other basic screening techniques.

Physiotherapy Camp

Our friends and physiotherapy consultants Sudha and Madhuvansh organized a 2-day camp. They assessed people at the center and also visited a couple of nearby villages and prescribed therapy. Vasuki and Dhanam, our senior Health Advocates who were trained by the two physiotherapists, went to the villages every day for the next 7 days to complete the therapy for elders who were unable to come to the center.

Blood Donation Camp

A Blood donation camp was organized on 25th May 2022 in partnership with Adaikkampatti PHC (Primary Health Care center). This is our 4th blood camp, 52 donors came forward to donate blood out of which 37 were able to donate. This is a great way to connect with the PHC and mutually support each other.

School and Community Health Education

School Health Education plays a major role in instilling healthy habits and teaching the importance of personal hygiene to young children. Keeping this in mind, our Health Animators visit nearby schools to teach health education to elementary and middle school children. These classes have had a positive impact on children, the teachers and parents have observed noticeable changes in their hygiene habits.

- Each month, 3 Health Animators visit 55 schools in 40 villages in and around Perambalur district
- 5618 children studying in classes
 1-9 have benefited from this

We use various mediums such as Tabs, Picture charts, and Anatomy puzzles to teach health education in schools. The School Health Education initiative covers a wide range of topics such as:

- Self-Hygiene Hand wash methods
- Tooth hygiene
- Home remedies
- Biology Digestive system, functions of the heart, lungs, liver, and other internal organs of the body
- Nutrition Healthy snacks and consequences of junk food
- Safe touch & Unsafe touch
- Adolescence Anaemia
- First Aid for Bone fracture
- Skin diseases and so on

The **Community health education** initiative this year has seen more interactions and healthy discussions between the HAs, doctors and the villagers after COVID. We held a health exhibition this year on the theme of **"What is bone injury and how to address it?"** It was aimed at reducing disability caused by incorrect treatment methods. The number of pregnant women who become anemic has significantly reduced this year due to the continuous monitoring and dietary advice given by our Health Animators. The new health animators recruited from the nearby villages were trained by Dr. Preethi on science, gender and social analysis, anatomy and physiology, nutritional science and common illnesses. Our senior HA, Vanitha attended a 10-day residential training on gender perspectives conducted by our friend organization, EKTA Madurai.

Supplementary Nutrition Program

- Beneficiaries : 986 children in 14 Government schools
- No of Days Supplied : 96 days

The objective of this initiative is to enhance the nutritional well-being of children attending government schools. As part of the Supplementary Nutrition Program, the children are given healthy Laddus made of lentil sprouts and nuts. The RSTC children are also given Sundal made of lentils in addition to the Laddus. This program has garnered widespread recognition and appreciation from students, parents, as well as government school headmasters and teachers. Expressions of gratitude, including thank-you letters and video testimonials, were heartily shared with us.



Education Beyond Classrooms

Aarvam - The Exploratorium



Introduction

Aarvam - the exploratorium - is a space for rural children - primarily for government school kids. Aarvam is a key initiative, most certainly a flagship, of our many initiatives fulfilling Payir's commitment to our children...giving them a happy and healthy childhood, a space for creative inquiry.

One of the important inspirations for Aarvam Exploratorium is <u>www.exploratorium.edu</u> - a public learning laboratory where one can understand the world around them by exploring through science, art, and human perception.

Why

Rural children, from their early childhood, grow up observing the multi-dimensional ways of life, natural setting of phenomena, practical activities of occupation, and many constructs of society. Later on, by and large, the school curriculum and pedagogy, and complexity of information (these days, the syllabus has better gradation with gradual learning of topics) impedes understanding and application of knowledge.

Say, a child, intrinsically, observes and knows many forms of matter and for a rural kid, additionally, they experience in many ways when matter transforms state, say, with heat. Our personal experience is, that they even relate this practically to Conservation! - without attaching it to any word or constitution or concept or law.

At Aarvam, we feel the best of technology and collaborative approaches be explored to create cost-effective, accessible, redistributable content knowledge and learning experiences.

What

Aarvam will be that space evoking wonder, a space for curious observation, for hands-on experimenting, measuring, crafting, and for enthusiastic interaction, reflecting on various dimensions, analysis, and creating the linkages - starting, deriving from and applying these to their own local environment and situations, thus by, enrich understanding of each term portion in areas of Science, Humanities and Maths.

Central Kitchen which facilitates large groups, kids & visitors. Comfort dorms for Guests.



Makers Space

Space for kids to explore, ideate, and fabricate basic & intermediate-level engineering design.



Space Observatory

A place for kids to observe, understand and explore space. To comprehend a deep understanding of humanities, history, geography & anthropology & astronomy.

Teachers' Experience

- Aarvam was started in Dec of 2022, and since then five teachers have been onboarded
- By attending workshops and training, teachers have gained a lot of experience during the past year
- Besides the textbooks, the teachers refer to other books and study materials before teaching the kids

Students Learning Experience

- Students who found Math to be a difficult subject are now able to grasp the concepts better after attending our math workshops giving them more confidence in the subject
- Science experiments are conducted using materials that are commonly found in their dayto-day lives. Hence Science has become more fun and easy to understand
- Children are shown documentaries on topics like the solar system, wildlife, birds, marine life, etc., which gives them an opportunity to learn about nature and science
- Students experiment with arts and crafts using different materials such as clay, wood, and other natural materials such as palm leaves and coconut shells
- Students go on field trips to local historical and archaeological sites. This gives them a better understanding of our history and they also learn about evolution
- Parents are very happy to see their children eager to learn and understand concepts

Community-based special education interventions

Started with 35 children in 9 villages and by the end of the year, it expanded to 65 children in 12 villages

A work we started in 2021, expanded with the efforts of Ms. Ranjitha at the field level. Guided and anchored by Ms. Alli Murugesan and Dr. Krupa Natarajan from Vasantham Special School, we take our service door to door, teaching therapy techniques, counselling the children and parents, connecting them to surgical and interventional services and so on. In the year 2022, the Vasantham team visited Payir twice for an in-person evaluation of the children. The year started with 35 children in 9 villages and by the end of the year, it expanded to 65 children in 12 villages. Every child is assessed by the Vasantham team, they send their recommendations online, Ranjitha does the needed work and the Vasantham team monitors for the improvements as well.

With our efforts,

- Augxxx 6 yrs Cleft palate repair surgery done
- Mukxxx 12 yrs with macular dystrophy received a 4X magnifying glass
- Shaxxx 12 yrs got hearing aid adjusted to current needs after almost 6 years
- Gajxxx 24 yrs receives Govt pension of Rs. 2000 since Dec 2022
- Nitxxx 4 yrs started walking 3 months ago
- Speech therapy helped 3 children pick up talking
- Sajxxx 9 yrs toilet trained for the first time in his life

And there are many such positive impact stories.

Adolescent Education Program

Started the Adolescent Education Program in 8 villages

The adolescent children of today face major issues such as depression, substance abuse, lack of focus, etc,. Besides this, they also lack the necessary knowledge and skills they need to face their future. A lot of this is due to social media impact, improper use of technology, and lack of resources and proper guidance. In the rural areas, the problems of adolescent children are compounded by poverty, lack of resources and lack of awareness among the parents. We at Payir are addressing this problem by:

- Educating adolescent children on how the Human body works not just in the physical sense but also from a social perspective
- Teaching them life skills such as communication, problem-solving, teamwork and interpersonal relationships
- Talking to them about gender stereotypes and how to break them by having a broader perspective
- Conducting workshops, and storytelling sessions and inviting guest speakers to speak to them
- Encouraging them to participate in activities that nurture their creativity

After one year, we see that they have gained more knowledge about the human body, and they are better at communication and teamwork. They also have a broader level of understanding of gender and society and seem to have more self confidence. In the future, we plan to

- Publish a monthly newsletter or magazine to showcase their creative work
- Establish a Model Student Parliament
- Teach them to use technology to their advantage
- Teach them self-analysis and self-control to combat addiction issues

Early Childhood Development Center

We are well aware that the extent of opportunities and accessibility of resources essential for the physical, sensory, social and emotional development of rural children consistently fall short. Payir decided to address this shortfall by launching an Early Childhood Learning Center in Thenur village, with intention of opening similar centers in a few other villages down the line.

On 21st February 2023, we launched our first center in Thenur equipped with an array of play materials for children aged 1 month to three years. Two of our staff members were trained in handling infants and toddlers. We have adopted a Montessori method of education, our staff visited "Thalir" a Montessori school in Madurai for two days of training. Currently, we have 6 children regularly visiting the center. We have observed significant improvements in the sensory perception, cognitive and social skills of the children who visit the center regularly. The parents are also taught about good disciplining techniques that they can practice at home.



Oneness with Nature Afforestation

A 5 member team led by Sharanya is working full time

- 2475 tree saplings have been planted in 3 villages -Thenur, Thottiapatti and Nakkasalem
- 7440 trees have been planted so far

Besides this, Thenur and Nathakadu schools have received nearly 200 tree saplings to plant around their surroundings. Also, three PHCs in Chettikulam, Kannapadi and Adaikampatti have received 15 tree saplings each. The nursery team is also engaged in seed collection and those seeds are sowed and raised in the nursery. There are more than 35 varieties of tree saplings in our nursery.

Planting of 18,600 saplings around the Ariyalur mines was a great success this year, which was a joint effort with Thoorigai. More than 15 varieties of saplings were planted within three months.

Uzhavu Thiruvizha

2000 people from 62 different organizations including several schools and NGOs participated in the event

This year for the first time we organized a Uzhavu Thiruvizha (Farmer's Festival) at the Payir campus. When Dr. Ko Sitthar, a renowned naturopathy doctor and a farmer, also our mentor and guide, inaugurated our Naturopathy in-patient therapy center in May 2022, he sowed the seed for the Uzhavu Thiruvizha. His speech during the inauguration inspired us to organize the Uzhavu Thiruvizha function.

We invited experts from the farming community, social activists and Dr. Ko Sitthar to speak at the event. The two-day festival gave us an opportunity to talk about some very important topics such as natural (organic) farming, embracing a healthy lifestyle and safeguarding our traditional seeds. Some of the farmers, NGOs, horticulturalists, artisans, and natural food enthusiasts set up stalls at the event to showcase and sell their products such as grains, seeds, food items and other eco-friendly items. We had also organized a science exhibition on snakes that are commonly found in Thenur and surrounding areas, it became a huge hit among the children. Several people including school children, villagers and farmers attended the two-day festival and thoroughly enjoyed it. Since the event was a huge success we decided to continue the tradition in the coming years.





Kitchen and Herbal Garden initiatives

In addition to providing health education, the Health Animators also educated students about the advantages of cultivating both kitchen and herbal gardens within their households. As a result of these efforts, several families of these students have now taken up the practice of maintaining their own kitchen gardens at home.

Our Siddha doctor has been instrumental in creating an herbal garden at the Payir campus and also at 2 PHCs and 5 schools.

Thoorigai and Thinai -Women's Collective

- Provides livelihood for 25+ families
- After COVID things are slowly picking up, but we need more patrons
- > Thinai: Deepavali Millet Laddu orders close to 1000 kgs
- > Thoorigai: Titan order for making bags for Tanishq as well as CSR giveaway bags

For the women working in Theorigai and Thinai, this is a big opportunity to not only be self-sustaining but also provide for their families. After COVID, things are slowly picking up but still, it is not sufficient. We need more patrons and more orders for Theorigai and Thinai to be profitable.



Thinai - Food Processing Unit

- We make healthy malt and millet-based laddus
- 783 children including the RSTC children at Payir are being served the healthy laddoos as part of the Supplementary Nutrition Program
- 40 kgs of millet are given to the children every day as healthy snacks
- A healthy porridge is made from the health mix and served to the RSTC kids every day
- We also take commercial orders for our laddoos and health mix from corporates, schools and individuals
- We take pride in our quality and hygiene standards

Thoorigai - Bag Making Unit

- 120 different types of bags, purses
- Natural, eco-friendly, 100% handmade
- Thoorigai unit has taken the next step by shifting to its own building in Thenur village
- Purchased a fusing machine for ironing Juco material
- Exhibitions and Bulk Orders

- 810 shopping bags for Sankara Nethralaya
- Tata Education program provided school bags for poor kids
